Mandate

Alberta's future economic growth and prosperity will depend in large part on the ability to remain competitive in an increasingly global energy marketplace. The Natural Resources Committee recognizes that an effective policy environment encourages investment and stimulates economic growth. The group is committed to maintaining and enhancing Calgary's position as a world leader within the energy industry.

2008 – 2009 Committee Focus Areas

- Provincial Land Use Framework (cumulative effects management, alignment with other provincial plans and policy, regulatory efficiency)
- Carbon management policy / strategy (pricing of carbon, research / investment, energy efficiency, carbon capture and storage)
- Water policy
- Alternative Energy / Alberta 2050 Energy Strategy (Premier's initiative; role of nuclear power)

Summary of Previous Year's Work

The Environment Committee spent much of the year collaborating with the Chamber's Natural Resources Committee on issues related to the energy industry both provincially and nationally. The Committee spent the early half of the season learning about, and making recommendations on the new Provincial Land Use Framework. These recommendations helped to inform the Chamber's Alberta Chambers of Commerce resolution *Provincial Land-use Framework: Achieving Sustainable Development While Improving the Regulatory Environment*.

The balance of the Committee's work was largely spent researching and developing a low carbon energy vision that was presented to the federal and provincial Ministers of Environment. Members of the Natural Resources and Environment Committees heard from a diverse set of speakers including Gerry Protti (CAPP), Leah Lawrence (Clean Energy Capitalists) and Rick Hyndman (CAPP) to help inform this vision. A Climate Change Task Force was also struck to ensure the Chamber's position fully addressed Alberta's needs in a changing energy environment. This initiative also led to the Alberta Chambers of Commerce Resolution *Positioning Alberta to Lead in Energy Innovation*.
